

Masks for Rock Island Academy


Thomas Ryan, the principal of Rock Island Academy has expressed a need for a stockpile of masks for the students of the Academy. Kids will begin coming back to school on a part-time basis after Labor Day in Rock Island. Every student will be required to wear a mask while in school.



He anticipates a need for a supply of extra masks to be able to give to kids who do not have one, forget one, or

lose one during the course of the school day. Many of our mask makers have continued their efforts, but to meet the increased demand we have decided to also purchase masks in bulk.

If you are still making masks, we will continue to accept donations. You can also make a monetary donation to "Masks for Meals," which will help purchase masks. Our goal is to provide the school one mask for every student at Rock Island Academy, and we will allow them to determine how they will distribute the masks. Mr. Ryan expects around 400 kids enrolled, but is unsure of how many will actually begin in-school learning.

Two Anti-Racism Interviews

Doing the work of anti-racism is an important part of Christian discipleship. The adult Sunday school class has been reading the book *America's Original Sin* by Jim Wallis. There are other tremendous books, videos, and ways to be educated about how we as Christians can be actively at work against racism. Another resource is Pastor Robb's podcast. The Pulpit Fiction Podcast.

Pastor Robb is the host of the Pulpit Fiction Podcast. This is a weekly Bible Study that you can listen to from any com-

puter or device with an internet connection. There are also monthly interviews with authors. Two recent interviews focused on these issues of anti-racism.

The first was with Terrell Carter, a former Saint Louis police officer and pastor. His book *Police on a Pedestal: Responsible Policing in a Culture of Worship* is an important look at what police reform could look like. The second was with Brenda Salter McNeil, the author of *Becoming Brave: Finding the Courage to Pursue Racial Justice Now*. This book is a deep-dive into the biblical book of *Esther*, finding powerful parallels between her courageous efforts for her people and the current struggle for racial justice.


I have read story after story of churches who have gathered and become hot spots for the spread of this dangerous virus. As you may remember, we had a date picked out for outdoor worship at Camp Milan, but reports of surging numbers – especially locally – caused us to postpone that gathering.

I want to let you know my thinking on this subject. There are many churches who have decided unequivocally "we will not gather in 2020." I do not want to make that sort of declaration prematurely. I want to gather again. I believe we can do it relatively safely.

I am also quite concerned about students going back to school in September. I fear that a surge in local cases may come from this. I personally will not feel comfortable gathering until at least a couple of weeks after this happens. This waiting period will also give the weather a chance to cool off a little, making outdoor worship more comfortable to all.

Please do not read this is a declaration of what we are doing or how we will proceed. I simply wanted to share with the congregation my personal thoughts. These decisions will still be made in community, with our Church Leadership Council at the helm.

Hello everyone,

It's nearing the end of August and I should be anticipating restarting our music program. Sadly we are still in the hold of the Coronavirus and it simply isn't safe for us to either worship in person, nor to make music together.

Music making produces an interesting and complex set of challenges beyond the realms of everyday safety that we now use. Let me explain.

Why No Singing

When one sings, one projects a larger column of air from the body than one does with speaking. The larger column of air produces more air velocity, that is to say that the air moves faster when singing or reciting, than when we are just speaking. In addition, because the air is leaving our bodies, it collects things within our lungs; moisture, mucus, and many micro-organisms and germs that live within us. In exhalation, those things leave our body. This happens with every breath we take. When we sing, that larger column of air becomes more turbulent. It takes those microparticles and combines them with the air to create aerosol. This aerosol leaves the body at a much higher speed than a usual breath because the particles are significantly smaller.

With a normal breath, the particles settle out of the air in pretty quick measure, usually within an hour or so. The germs remain virulent for the entire time they are in the air and can survive on surfaces for some time after that. For this reason we have protocols in place: masks, hand sanitizer, hand washing all help to protect us and keep us from being infected by the virus.

When we speak loudly, or sing, those aerosolized particles are much smaller, and can remain in the air for much longer, up to eight hours. Also because of their minute size, they can bypass some of the filters we use to stay away from the virus. Aerosol can pass through many types of masks. I find this to be extremely scary. Studies have shown that safe distancing for singing should be twelve feet with the use of masks.

Obviously, this makes singing in a choir nearly impossible. We would have to spread the choir through the entire nave of the church to achieve appropriate social distancing. The other alternative is to surround each singer with plexiglass, another impractical idea.

Needless to say, when we come back, it will be a while before we will be able to enjoy choral music in church again. In the meantime, I continue to ask anyone who is interested to contribute music to our service. We have been blessed with a number of contributors through the summer, and will continue to add more musicians to our services as we go along.

Alternatives for when it is safe

Bell choir will be the first group of musicians to return to service. It is possible to socially distance bell players and to group family units to specific table. Once we begin meeting again at the church, bell choir will return. Masks will be a must for every bell choir member; and that completes the list of requirements to play bells. Anyone would be welcome to join. I have considered creating a second bell choir for newcomers (if there would be enough) to bring them up to speed and be able to join the more advanced group. Again, start dates would be subject to returning to worship.

Another group that could also get back quickly would be the Ukulele Choir. In the past this has been open to adults, but if youth wished to join, they would be more than welcome. Masks required, previous experience is not. If you do not have a ukulele, don't worry. The church has several and can provide you with one for as long as you need.

In the meantime, if you have a musical talent stashed away that you would like to share, please let me know. Send me a video and I will link it to Robb to put into our Worship at Home service. Monday at noon: Bible Study

This group will continue to meet as usual. The noon Bible study focuses on the Bible passage that will be used in the upcoming sermon. The discussion of this group helps Pastor Robb explore issues and questions that will help form the sermon. There are many times when insights from this discussion group go directly into the worship experience. Those who participate consistently feel like their worship experience is enhanced because of their Monday conversation.

Wednesday at noon: Prayer and Devotion

This will be a combination of the two experiences that have previously been on Tuesday and Thursday. The group will begin with a short reflection by Pastor Robb on the day's Scripture reading (as found in the weekly Grow Pray Study insert). After this short reflection, the group will share their prayer concerns and reasons for joy. Pastor Robb will then lead the group in prayer.

On most Sunday mornings, the Worship at Home video live premiere will end at 10:15. This gives people about 15 minutes to move from watching the Worship at Home live video presentation on Facebook to joining into the Zoom meeting room.
