CARING CONVERSATIONS or REFLECTIONS

- Thinking about "Forgive Us as we forgive" Think of forgiveness as a process. It is not a simple lever to pull or a switch to flip. "As we forgive" not "after we forgive." Is this helpful when you think about people you need to forgive?
- Thinking About "Lead us not into temptation": Consider fasting this week. This was an theme in the "Daily Bread" sermon. If you can do so and remain healthy, consider one meal one day a week to fast from—and use that time for prayer, study, or reflection on how God is at work in your life.
- ♦ **The Prayer**: As you pray the Lord's Prayer this week, do so deliberately and slowly. Take your time with each phrase. Pause and take time to listen to how God is speaking to you in between the lines of prayer.
