

# Hear: Deuteronomy's call to Listen, Obey, and Choose

In July we will share a three-part series on the Book of Deuteronomy. The final book of the Biblical section known as the Torah (or Pentateuch, or Five Books of Moses), Deuteronomy means "Second Words." It is framed as Moses speaking to the people on the eve of entering the Promised Land. The three-part series will coincide with the three parts of Deuteronomy.

The first part is Moses' initial speech in which he summarizes the people's story of escape from Egypt. Here we have the famous "Shema" of Deuteronomy 6:1-9, which is known as the most important law of the Torah. The second part is the summary of the laws, including Deuteronomy 10:12-22, the Ten Commandments. The final part is Moses' final speech admonishing the people to obey and warnings that prophets would come to set the people straight when they strayed. It is a call to choose God as seen in Deuteronomy 30:11-20.

# **Worship at Schwiebert Park**

On **August 3** we will once again gather at Schwiebert Park at 10:30 a.m. Two other churches, The House: A Local Congregation and Gaines Chapel AME will also be there. Pastors Greg Hampton, Mason Parks, and Robb McCoy will create a program focused on community building and lifting up the connection between our churches. 


# **Fundraiser For Mission STL**

# 2025 Annual Conference Report

The 2025 Annual Conference of Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church was held June 5 through 7 in Peoria, Illinois. The theme for this year's conference was Rivers of Grace: Hope that Doesn't Disappoint with Romans5:5 as the Bible reference.



Friday mornings work began with a opening worship service lead by Bishop Kennetha Bingham-Tsai and included an offering for Africa University. Her message was on HOPE - Healing, Outreaching, Peace Seeking, Everlasting Grace. This was followed by Laity and Clergy sessions. The laity session included an offering for the John Kofi Asmah School Maintenance Fund. The John Kofi Asmah School in Liberia was built by lay donations from the Great Rivers Conference and we try to keep it maintained and functioning.

The afternoon session began with a memorial service and celebration of life and an offering for the IGRC Camping Scholarship. At 3:30 we got down the legislative work of the conference. The first test vote was on whether anyone would address Bishop Bard as Bishop Beard. We were pretty confident it would happen, and it did. The first order of business after approving the rules was to vote on the four Constitutional Amendments from the 2020/2024 General Conference. These Amendments came with headings of Regionalization, Inclusiveness, Racial Justice, and Clergy Education Requirements. For the amendments to pass they must receive an affirmative vote of two thirds of all those voting in all annual conferences worldwide. The results of vote will be announced some time in November. The vote of our conference is never announced. The afternoon ended with an order of business of an apology past pain caused by the Church over sexual misconduct. Councilors were available for those who needed them at the end of the session.

Friday morning began at 8:30 with a Service of Ministry Celebration which included the consecration of a Deaconess/Home Missioner. This service also included an offering for the Tom Brown Scholarship at Wiley University. The legislative session got underway at 10:00. The afternoon session began at 2:00 with a Service of Recognition for Retirees and an offering for IGRC Campus Ministries. The final legislative session began at 3:15 in the afternoon.

For the most part the whole conference was very upbeat. A few wanted to argue that the Church is in crisis and possibly dying. Most held the view that we have come through some very difficult times and are healing and moving forward. We had the usual reports from Preachers' Aid Society and the Board of Pensions. Six items were passed as part of a consent agenda, including one designating the Verla Ewing Retreat Center as one of twenty-five Conference Historical Sites. Equitable Compensation and Clergy Health Insurance Allowance were passed at written without too much debate. The most contentious items on the agenda this year were Financial Support for Little Grassy and Exploring the Sale of the Conference Center.

Saturday morning was the joyous Service of Ordination and fixing of appointments. An offering was taken for the Bishops' Study Trip for Ordinands. Our tandem bishops were having so much fun playing with the babies baptized as part of the service that they lost their place in the liturgy. The sermon to the newly ordained was delivered by Bishop David Bard.

This concludes my report.

**Calling all Confirmation Candidates** 

Confirmation is a program for young people to claim their own faith. It is common in churches that baptize infants or young people to "make firm" the commitment that was made on their behalf when they were an infant. The age for confirmation is not strictly defined, but it is usually for youth ages 11-15.

This fall we are going to begin a confirmation class with other United Methodist Churches in the area. The idea is for the class to meet on Sunday afternoon in a rotating model between churches in Rock Island, Moline, East Moline, and Colona. We believe that each church has 1-5 youth interested in confirmation, and this will give us a class large enough to have good discussion and build bonds between our churches.

If you have a student in this age group, please let Pastor Robb know that they are interested in Confirmation. The group will begin to meet in the fall with Confirmation Sunday coming the first Sunday of 2026. If your young person has not been baptized, we are planning on having baptisms in August at an outside worship service. Those who are baptized this summer should still participate in confirmation.
