January 18, 2026 - The second Sunday after Epiphany
Matthew 6:17-48 (abridged)

Don't even begin to think that I have come to do away with the Law and the Prophets. I haven't come to do away with them but to fulfill them. I say to you that unless your righteousness is greater than the righteousness of the legal experts and the Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

“You have heard that it was said to those who lived long ago, *Don't commit murder*, and all who commit murder will be in danger of judgment. But I say to you that everyone who is angry with their brother or sister will be in danger of judgment.

“You have heard that it was said, *Don't commit adultery*. But I say to you that every man who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery in his heart.

“It was said, ‘Whoever divorces his wife must *give her a divorce certificate*.’ But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife except for sexual unfaithfulness forces her to commit adultery. And whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

“Again you have heard that it was said to those who lived long ago: *Don't make a false solemn pledge, but you should follow through on what you have pledged to the Lord*.” But I say to you that you must not pledge at all. You must not pledge by heaven, because it's God's throne.

“You have heard that it was said, *An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth*. But I say to you that you must not oppose those who want to hurt you. If people slap you on your right cheek, you must turn the left cheek to them as well.

“You have heard that it was said, *You must love your neighbor and hate your enemy*. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who harass you so that you will be acting as children of your Father who is in heaven. Therefore, just as your heavenly Father is complete in showing love to everyone, so also you must be complete.
